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Chablis Grand Cru « Blanchot » 2023

Racked to tank but not yet the final wine, which is expected to be bottled in February, this is showing nicely and bodes well for the overall cuvée. Fine spice, light cream, ginger, dried lotus flower and lemon pulp seize the nose. Sassy acidity lifts the good mid-palate sap.

Chablis Grand Cru « Les Clos » 2023

Coming from the bottom of Les Clos by the house, these vines are at least 50 years old. This is quite the little nugget of concentrated flavors with generous helpings of thyme, licorice, peach and Meyer lemon. While still sitting in the tank, this is already nicely cohesive.

Chablis Grand Cru « Preuses » 2023

Taut and citrusy, Paul says that it is worth waiting four to five years for this cuvée's characteristic passion fruit and pineapple flavors. There is plenty of punchy concentration leading to a solid finish that suggests you can wait even longer—not surprising considering that these are very old vines planted back in the 1950s.
